SFPD Make Arrests in Shotgun Robbery Series. A Male Juvenile Exited a Getaway Vehicle and Robbed Pedestrians at Gunpoint 19-036

Monday, April 01, 2019

In the early morning hours of Friday March 8, 2019, officers from San Francisco Police Department's Taraval and Park Police Stations responded to several reports of armed robberies.

At approximately 6:30AM a male victim was walking on the sidewalk near the area 8th Avenue and Noriega Street when a male subject jumped out of a vehicle, produced a shotgun and demanded the victim's property. The victim gave the suspect his phone and wallet. A few minutes later another victim was walking in the area of 9th Avenue and Lawton Street when a male suspect jumped out of a vehicle produced a shotgun and demanded the victim's property. The victim gave the suspect his phone and day planner. At approximately 7:11AM a female victim was walking on the 400 block of Warren Drive when a male subject jumped out of a vehicle, produced a shotgun and demanded the victim's property. The victim said that she didn't have anything for the suspect. The suspect got back into the vehicle and fled the scene. The female was able to take a picture of the suspect vehicle as it fled the scene.

In all three incidents the victims described the suspects as young Latin males driving a white sport utility vehicle. In all three incidents the suspects utilized a shotgun and threatened to shoot the victims if they did not comply with their demands. Investigators from San Francisco Police Department's Robbery Detail responded and commenced their investigation.

On March 12th, the vehicle used in the commission of the robberies, a white Ford Explorer was located in Pittsburg, California. Investigators located stolen property from one of the incidents inside the vehicle.

The vehicle led investigators to two 17 year - old male suspects from Oakland, California. San Francisco Police investigators served search warrants on both of the juvenile suspect's homes on March 26th. While serving the search warrant investigators located several firearms including a shotgun.

The two juveniles were booked at the San Francisco County Juvenile Justice Center on several counts of robbery, attempted robbery, assault with a firearm, felony firearm enhancement.

Due to the suspect's ages booking photos will not be released.

Taraval Community Members, We are seeing an increase in burglaries targeting homes that are under construction. In these incidents, suspects would break into the building or construction sites and steal numerous high end construction equipment. Currently, if your home is under construction and no one is at that location after work hours, please call Taraval Station at 415-759-3100 and provide your name and the address of the construction site and phone number. We can have our officers conduct passing calls.

Burglary Awareness & Prevention Tips for Construction Sites



Securing & Preventing

- 1. Secure all equipment and vehicles at all times.
- 2. Take effort to reduce the visibility of tools and equipment secured in vehicles or on job sites.
- 3. Make use of adequate lighting in conjunction with open chain-link fencing on the perimeter to allow for high visibility to the job site.
- 4. Strongly consider the use of security systems such as alarms and video surveillance. Ensure signage for such is clearly visible.

Precautionary Measures

- 1. Photograph all tools. Ensure photographs clearly show the associated serial number and/or distinctive markings.
- 2. Ensure job site keys are marked "Do Not Duplicate" and are controlled at all times.
- 3. Attempt to park employee vehicles within visual range of the job

Should a Burglary Occur

Immediately contact 911. Be prepared to provide the following information:

- a) Time of incident.
- b) Video (if available).
- c) Items taken (include make, model, description, location taken from, value, photos and serial numbers).
- d) Insurance information.
- e) Owner's information.

Public Safety Advisory

Construction Site Burglaries & Thefts



Construction site burglaries and thefts are a common and costly occurrence in San Francisco. Valuable time and money are lost when equipment and materials are stolen from a worksite or vehicle. Consider the following suggestions to reduce your risk of being victimized:

- Plan the site security well in advance.
- Network with law enforcement, contact the local district police station to provide work site location and work hours.
- Notify the surrounding neighbors by providing them with a "Courtesy Note" asking them to report any suspicious activity or crime immediately to the police. Provide them with additional emergency contact information and work hours.
- Lighting is a good crime deterrent. Prepare the site for additional lighting around the perimeter.
- Inventory, engrave or mark your tools for recovery. Tools and equipment should be inscribed with your CA driver's license number. This will help police locate the owner of recovered tools or equipment and help with testimony at a trial. Materials and equipment should be secured in a cargo container for storage if not removed from the work site.
- Construction site doors and windows should be secured by locks, otherwise fencing or boarding should be erected.
- Good communication between the site supervisor and employees is vital so that
 doors and windows are not left open or unsecured at the end of the workday.
 Provide employees with written instructions on security expectations. It should
 be the responsibility of the Construction Supervisor to lock up the site.
- Screen your employees. Employees should wear visible identification. Never assume someone on site is a construction worker.
- Avoid leaving equipment vehicles at an unattended worksite.
- Secure portable toilet door with a padlock.

Beware of Scams

Fake Check Scams

Consumers paid with phony checks for work or for items they're trying to sell, instructed to wire money back to buyer

Prizes/Sweepstakes/Free Gifts

Requests for payment to claim fictitious prizes, lottery winnings, or gifts

Recovery/Refund Companies

Scammers contact victims and claim the consumer owes money on a fictitious debt or to help recover money lost in a previous scam

Advance Fee Loans, Credit Arrangers

False promises of business or personal loans, even if credit is bad, for a fee upfront

Phishing/Spoofing

Emails pretending to be from a well-known source ask consumers to enter or confirm personal information

Computers: Equipment and Software

Scammers claim to offer "technical support" for computer problems and charge a fee to fix a nonexistent problem

Scholarships/Grants

For a fee, a "search company" offers to conduct customized search for scholarships or grants for students. Scammers take money and run or provide a worthless list

Friendship & Sweetheart Swindles

Con artist nurtures an online relationship, builds trust, and convinces victim to send money

Charitable Solicitations

Scammers contact victims claiming to represent non-existent charities (or real charities they don't actually work for) and ask for donations.

Definition of Suspicious Activity

Suspicious activity is any observed behavior that could indicate a crime-related incident has been committed, or about to be committed. Unusual items or situations: A vehicle is parked in an odd location, a package/luggage is unattended, a window/door is open that is usually closed, or other out-of-the-ordinary situations occur.

Examples of Suspicious Activity:

- An individual peering into vehicles, to try, and locate any valuables left unattended.
- An individual trying door handles to vehicles, and/or residences to gain access to the vehicle and/ or residence.
- An individual checking front doors of residences to locate any unattended packages or individuals following delivery trucks to see where the truck is dropping off packages.
- Please dial 911 to report crimes in progress, suspicious activity or for life threatening emergencies. If it is not an emergency, dial (415) 553-0123.



Definition of Community Policing

Community policing, or community-oriented policing, is a strategy of policing that focuses on police building ties and working closely with members of the communities.

Homeless Outreach and Outreach to Drug Users:

Taraval Station has two officers that coordinate with city agencies to provide outreach and assistance to rehabilitate those who are dependent on illegal drugs and outreach to homeless individuals to connect them with resources and support.

Foot Patrols:

Taraval Station has 3 foot beat locations. These officers are assigned to Irving St, West Portal Ave and Ocean Ave.

Monthly Police Community Relations Meetings:

Community Meetings are going to be held continuously. Officers and sergeants also attend meetings with merchants groups, business groups, development authorities and others. Concerns are voiced and addressed through problem solving. These meeting will be on the third Tuesday of each month.

Email Updates:

Taraval Station will send out newsletter updates to residents in the District that alerts residents of crime trends, upcoming community events, crime prevention tips, and information on how to contact officers at the District Station.
